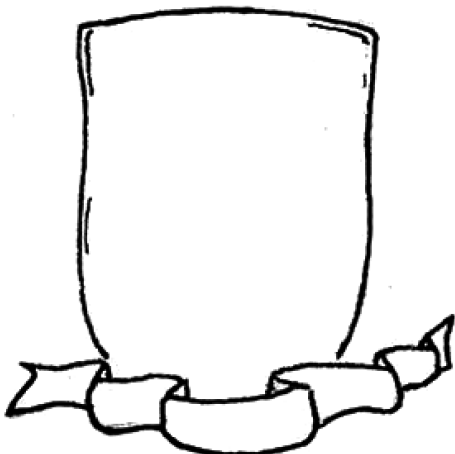

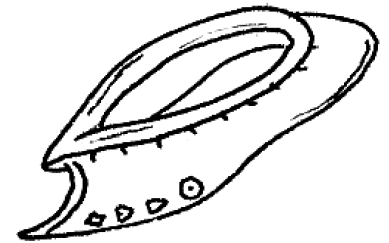

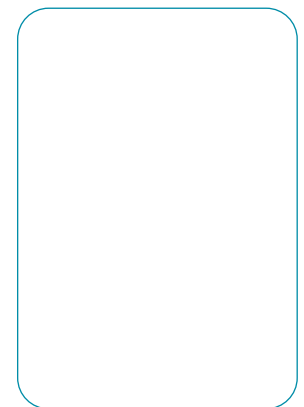

A slate and pencil instead of a pen and paper.

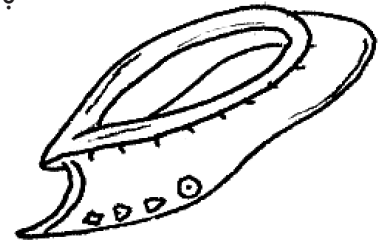
